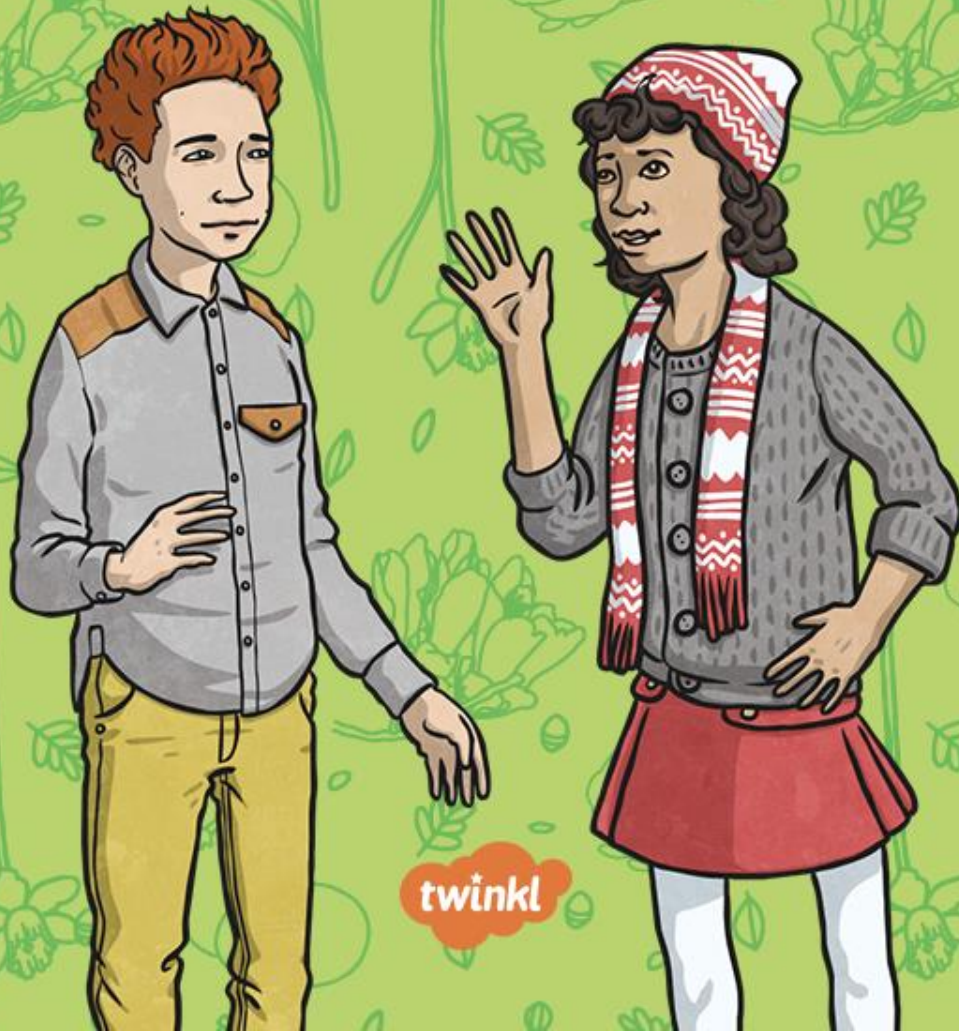


Word Families

Based on Common Words

This week, we are again looking at spellings that belong to the same family of words. Knowing that a word follows a particular pattern, can make them simpler to spell.

Many words share the same origin* or root word.



*The word 'origin' means where something came from or where it began.

The particular root words that we are going to look at this week are...

‘sign’

which is often associated with words that mean **to seal** or **to mark**.

‘solv’

which is often associated with words that mean **to loosen** or **to release**.

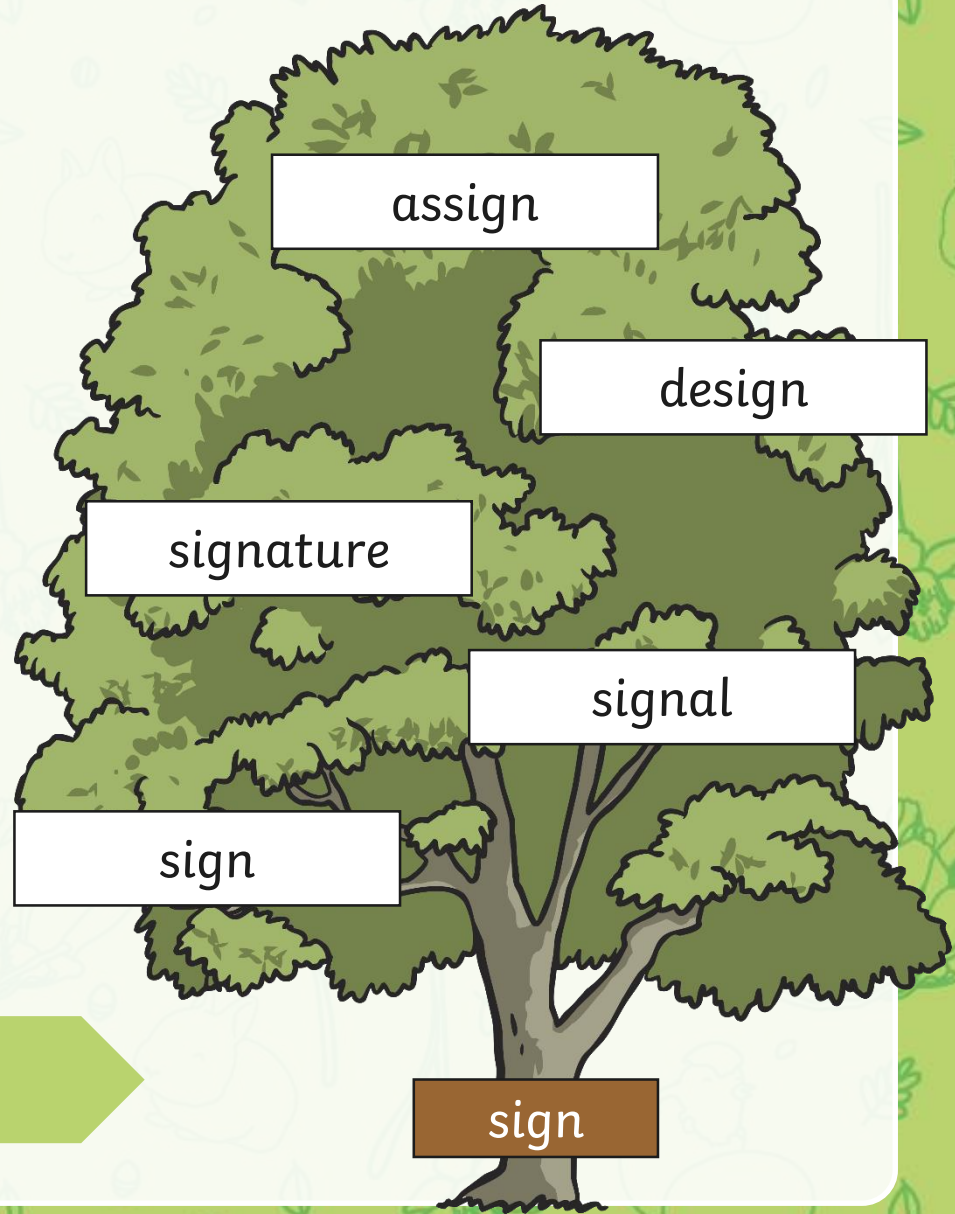

- Could you add in or change a verb/adjective for a more ambitious alternative?

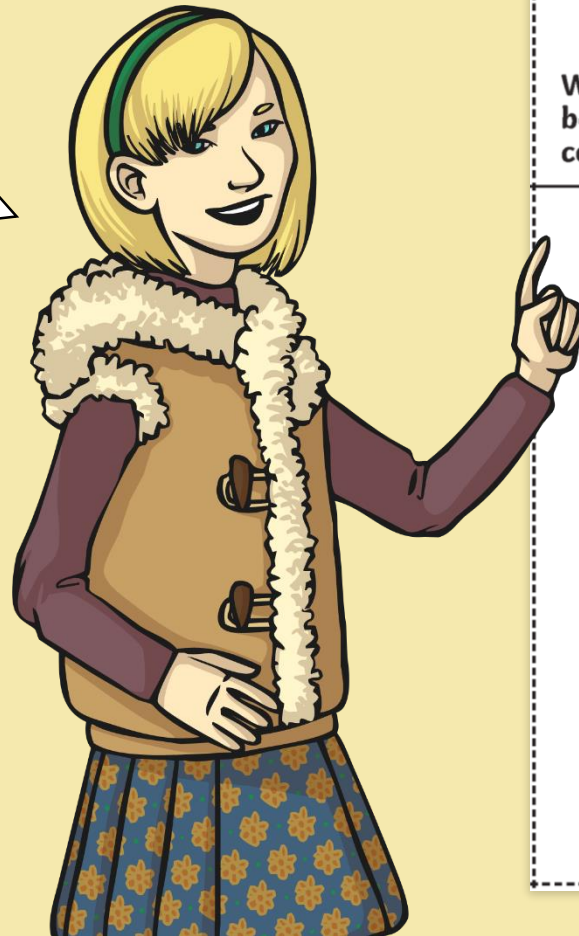
