Teaching Ideas

Dear Parents,

I hope this finds you well. Below are a few more activity ideas for you to do with your child over the next week.

Activity 1 – Pentecost

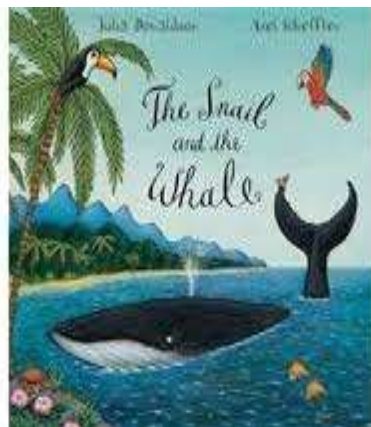
- We are still thinking about Pentecost and how Jesus kept his promise to send the disciples the Holy Spirit.



- Talk to your child about a time someone kept a promise to them. What was it like when it became true?
- Make some wind chimes using yogurt pots to help recall the sound of the Holy Spirit as it came to the disciples.

Activity 2 – Reading

- We are still looking at the book 'Whale and the Snail'.

- Talk about the story together:
 - What did the snail see on his journey?
 - Would you like to be the snail?
 - What do you like best about the story?
- Would the snail feel afraid?



Activity 2 – Writing

- Take some photos of you playing outside or going for walk or to the shops. You could write a phrase or caption to match the picture e.g. I can run very fast.
- Carry on practising your letters and writing your name.
- Make shopping lists and notes to people in your family.

Activity 3 – Understanding the World

- Can you go for a snail hunt? It is best to do this in the rain and look at their shells.
- Use the internet to find out some snail facts.

Activity 4 –Physical Development

- Take a paper plate or a circle of paper/card and draw your spiral.
- Cut directly on top of your spiral line from outside to the middle.
- Let your spiral dangle. Where will you put yours?
- If you want to make it more special decorate your plate first!



Activity 5 – Mathematics

- Count up to 20 using different voices eg happy, sad, deep, quiet.
- Say a number to your child and ask them to collect that number of objects from the house or garden.
- Practise writing numbers up to 10.
- Ask counting questions – what is 1 more than 8? What is 1 more than 9?
